We have collected approximately 80% of pledged support for the year (as of April 30, 2008). If you didn't get yours, or if you have questions, please call Cheryl at 585-9550. We had a very successful "Cash in Our Attics" Fantasy Auction. The event raised over \$7,000 for the congregation. Approximately 120 people attended and it was a great party. The special fund raising drives for the playground and piano will come to a close in June. Both have been very successful. Final approval for both projects will be voted on at the annual meetings. Pending congregational approval, the piano is scheduled to be delivered in June and the playground work to get underway this summer.

### **Tents of Hope**

In refugee camps, cramped 10-foot-by-12-foot tents are used to house people forced from their homes by violence and ongoing insecurity. But painted with bright colors and messages, tents can become symbols of peace and hope. That is the thinking behind Tents of Hope, a collaborative project taken up by UUSC's Drumbeat for Darfur campaign.

The Senior Youth participated in the Tents of Hope project [www.uusc.org/drumbeatfordarfur/tentsofhope/index.html](http://www.uusc.org/drumbeatfordarfur/tentsofhope/index.html) with other Springfield area youth. ALUUC will be hosting the tent on ????. By creating tents that are both unique works of art and ongoing focal points for assisting and establishing relationships with the people of Sudan, our community is provided with an opportunity to learn about the crisis in Darfur, while doing something creative, hopeful, and meaningful.

### **UUSC-UUA Cyclone Nargis Relief Fund**

UUSC and the UUA have joined together to launch a humanitarian relief fund to help cyclone survivors in Myanmar (formerly Burma). Cyclone Nargis hit Myanmar on Saturday, May 3, 2008, devastating coastal and inland regions. State officials have estimated the death toll at over 30,000, but agencies estimate that 100,000 have already perished. Tens of thousands are still missing, and millions more have been left homeless.

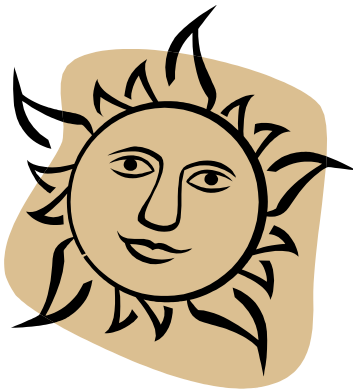
