## *From the Board President...*

Today the first iris bloom appeared in my yard---what a welcome sight! We lived in California many years ago, and the consistently mild weather was lovely. However, I am a true Midwesterner, and I feel that the diversity of our changing seasons is much more invigorating. Granted, the winter presents some challenges, but that just makes the arrival of spring more joyous.

Diversity is something we Unitarian-Universalists celebrate. We take great pride in the way we entertain and accept so many differing philosophical and religious viewpoints. We love to engage in lively discussions about our various beliefs, and we are willing to endure a little discomfort to accommodate many readings, hymns, and spiritual practices that might not be totally relevant to us. We have made progress in terms of making our congregations welcoming for GLBT persons, and this particular church serves people in every economic class. We speak out against intolerance and bigotry, yet we have one glaring blind spot that we just can't see our way to get around. UU's are overwhelmingly white, and this robs us of the vitality that we could be experiencing in our spiritual family.

In our personal experience, being an interracial family has brought incredible richness to our lives. Kent and I place a high value on stepping outside of our comfort zones and placing ourselves in situations where we are in the minority--which often feels strange in the beginning. However, since we are white, we have the luxury of stepping back into the ease and privilege of the majority whenever we feel like it. Our children and grandchildren do not have that choice. They live in the minority all day, every day. Our family has made an effort to build the relationships that have created our own village, and it has been time well spent. It sustains us as parents and provides African-American role models for our children. All of us, young and old, need the support of others who share an understanding of the significant issues that we face.

The recent issue of the UU World tackles the lack of racial and cultural diversity in our denomination, and I hope that everyone will take the time to read it. Just as most of us would get tired of being "the only one" if the shoe was on the other foot, many minority UU's are frustrated with our lack of progress. Perhaps we could be more fearless about inviting our friends of color to join us for a worship service now and then. Maybe our ethnic friends would enjoy some of our interesting activities. Since we have found something good here, it just may be what they are searching for, as well. We serve up a unique "religious stew" here at ALUUC, and adding some new flavors would make it so much more delicious!

### **Treasurer's Report February-March 2010**

#### **Per our financial statements for the month of February 2010:**

Operating revenue for February 2010: \$ 10,278  
Operating expenses for February 2010: \$ 15,795  
Mortgage liability paid in February 2010: \$ 1,930  
**Total Outflow for February 2010: \$ 7,447**



#### **Per our financial statements for the month of March 2010:**

Operating revenue for March 2010: \$ 18,298  
Operating expenses for March 2010: \$ 11,295  
Mortgage liability paid in March 2010: \$ 1,936  
**Total Inflow for March 2010: \$ 5,067**

#### **Year-to-date (YTD) results, July 2009-March 2010:**

Operating revenue YTD: \$ 141,729  
Operating expenses YTD: \$ 109,774  
Mortgage liability paid YTD: \$ 17,197  
**Total Inflow YTD: \$ 14,758**

Expenses have started to catch up to revenue, especially in February. In March, the revenue total received a once-a-year boost from the auction. Revenue and expenses will continue to even out as we near the end of the year—we budgeted to break even at the end of the fiscal year on June 30.

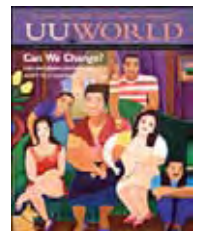
## UAA General Assembly

### **Fair Trade Products**

The ALUUC Social Action Committee (SAC) sponsored a special sale on Valentine's Day. Thanks to everyone who purchased chocolate bars and the other Fair Trade products (coffee, teas, and cocoa). The purchase of fair trade goods through the UUSC Coffee Project benefits agricultural cooperatives through UUSC's Small Farmer Fund. The UUSC Coffee Project is a collaboration between the UUSC and Equal Exchange, a worker-owned, fair trade company based in West Bridgewater, MA. ### **UUSC Conference Call: Haiti Update**

On January 12, an earthquake devastated Haiti. After evaluating the situation, UUSC and the UUA decided to open a joint relief fund to support UUSC's response. We have partnered with Haitian peasant organizations and sent relief to address the immediate crisis. We are also developing our response to mid- and long-term needs, including food sovereignty, women's and children's safety, and livelihoods for amputees, among other issues. UUSC staff have traveled to Haiti, most recently bringing a group of trauma counselors and a group of scientists who are developing alternative fuels. In the United States, we are organizing trainings for people to learn how to help Haitians living here apply for Temporary Protect Status, and subsequent clinics at which trainees assist Haitians in completing their applications. UUSC is also laying the groundwork for a future volunteer rebuild program in Haiti. We are deeply grateful for the work of our volunteers and supporters in raising funds for the work in Haiti, organizing events, and addressing the crisis in congregations. While support for the work in Haiti is crucial, so is support for our other ongoing human-rights programs. Please encourage your congregants to support UUSC's work in addition to the UUSC/UUA Joint Haiti Earthquake Relief Fund.

### **Become a UUSC Member**

Shareholder advocacy is one way that UUSC is lifting up human rights and working for real change. When large companies acknowledge the importance of human rights, this is a step in the right direction. The work continues as companies consider how to implement these new policies, and UUSC monitors the situation to be sure they follow through. Recently, our Unitarian Universalist Service Committee has had several important victories in shareholder advocacy work.

- **On February 18**, UUSC celebrated the announcement that following a November shareholder vote, American Funds has divested its extensive holdings — almost \$190 million — in PetroChina, a Chinese oil company that was identified as a major financial and military supporter of the ongoing genocide in the Darfur region of Sudan. UUSC has been working with colleague organization Investors Against Genocide (IAG) in the anti-genocide campaign in Sudan.
- **On March 19**, Intel, one of the world's largest manufacturers of semiconductor chips, adopted a human-right-to-water policy, as the result of a shareholder resolution co-filed by UUSC.



**UUSC membership is one important way you can support this work.** When you join UUSC, you are standing with us to challenge oppressive policies and create a more just world. 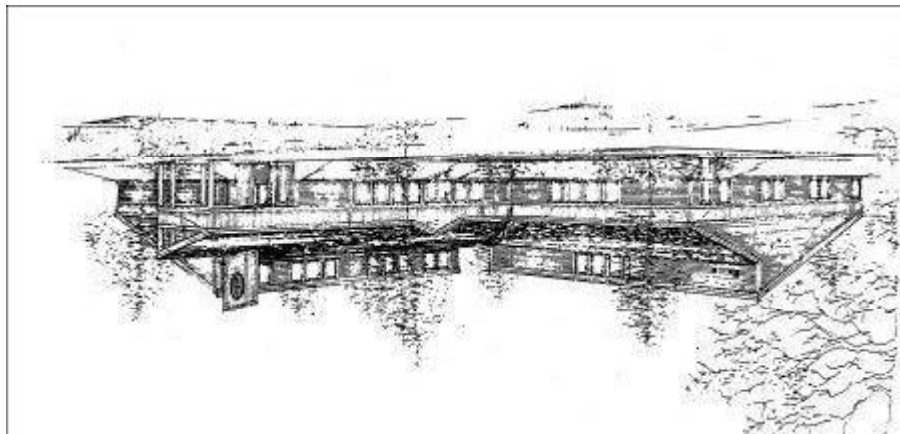
