The Illinois Commission on the Elimination of Poverty will hold a public hearing on September 7 from 6:30 - 9:00 pm at the Community Room, Bonansinga Hi Rise, 825 West Jefferson Street to discuss a Poverty Elimination Strategy that aims to cut the number of Illinoisans living in extreme poverty in half by 2015 in a manner consistent with international human rights standards. Child care will be provided and light food will be served.

Pax Christi Springfield and friends will hold a **Vigil in Commemoration of 9/11** on Sunday, 9/11 from 1pm to 2pm outside the Federal Building at 6th and Monroe. This will be a quiet vigil, and signs with positive messages are welcome. The public is welcome to participate in the vigil, which is in collaboration with Prairieland Compassion Network for the Greater Springfield Days of Compassion, 9/9 to 9/11.

On Sunday, September 11<sup>th</sup> at 2:30 pm, the **Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception (6<sup>th</sup> & Lawrence)** will hold a **Christian ecumenical service** to commemorate the tenth anniversary of the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. The choir will present John Rutter's *Requiem* during the service. Those who lost their lives in the attacks in New York City, Washington, DC and Shanksville, PA will be honored, as will all who have served or are serving in the military and those who serve as firefighters, police officers and EMTs.
