**The Social Action Committee has selected the Central Illinois Food Bank** for the July Change for Change collection. The purpose of Central IL Food Bank is to collect donated food and grocery items from growers, manufacturers, processors, distributors and retailers for distribution to charitable agencies serving people in need. It was established in 1982 by a coalition of churches, distributes nearly 8 million pounds of food annually to over 160 food pantries, soup kitchens, residential programs and after-school programs in a 21 county region. Central IL Food Bank is a member of Feeding America, the nation's largest domestic hunger relief organization, and is a United Way certified agency.

#### **Conversation Café - Immigration as a Moral Issue**

Migration of people—driven by economic, social, political and environmental factors—is taking place around the world. Millions are currently in transit, in refugee camps, in detention centers, or living and working in places without full legal status and without access to social services or protection of civil rights. Delegates at the 2010 General Assembly in Minneapolis, MN selected "Immigration" to be the 2010—2014 Congregational Study/Action Issue (CSAI) of the Unitarian Universalist Association of Congregations (UUA).
