**Today, July 1, is a Change for Change collection. The recipient is Sojourn Shelter & Services.** Sojourn provides emergency shelter and other advocacy services for adult and child victims of domestic violence. Last year, 7,044 lives were touched by Sojourn's services, including 8,426 nights of safe shelter and over 13,816 hours of advocacy to victims in our community.
