On **Saturday, July 15** at 4:00 PM, there will be a special showing of the film "**Rosenwald – the Remarkable Story of a Jewish Partnership with African-American Communities.**" The film is about Julius Rosenwald who was born in Springfield and became the president of Sears-Roebuck. This Jewish philanthropist joined forces with African-American communities to build over 5,300 schools during the early part of the 20th century. Among the recipients of the Rosenwald Foundation were Maya Angelou, Langston Hughes, Marian Anderson and Miles Davis. The film, which is being co-sponsored by the Jewish Federation of Springfield and numerous African-American organizations, will be shown at Union Baptist Church, 1405 East Monroe. Admission is free and there will be refreshments to follow.
