Hosts must agree to provide three meals per day, a place to sleep and to study, and transportation to and

from school when school bus transportation is not available. They are required to maintain a “B” average in their studies, must complete a minimum of 30 hours of volunteer service, and must join and participate in a leadership club or activity.
